#### Forthcoming fixtures.

The Committee have tried hard to set a winter fixture list that is both interesting and suitable for the time of year, the key consideration of winter golf being the lack of daylight hours. This means that the last of our games really struggle to get finished.

I am certain that we all would want every member to have the same enjoyment of their golf and it is therefore incumbent on all of us to play as quickly as possible to ensure the last games have time to finish before the Park closes.

The committee has selected formats that enable players to pick up when they cannot score – or when they cannot beat their partner's score. <u>Please ensure</u> <u>you do this.</u> The different games (bogey, pairs better ball etc) have all been well received and we will use the bogey format for the later monthly medal rounds (for the men at least) to prevent those muddy rounds with big numbers on the cards!

#### **Slow Play**

We can all do our bit for the poor players at the end of our games – and for each other – by ensuring we are not the ones causing slow play. The Winter Faster Play sheet is appended to this for all of us to remind ourselves of what we should be doing.

In addition, each week two 'faster play' points will be on the table in the portacabin. Please read them!!

Game marshals are being re-introduced. *Their* job is to make sure the game keeps right up with the game in front at all times by doing all the things the reminder sheets say to do to avoid slow play. *Your* job is to ensure the game marshal has nothing to do!

If the starter has not selected a game marshal for your game, pick one yourselves. This has to happen.

# Finally – we also want you to write your game number on your scorecards, together with the exact times you start and finish your game. This is to try to help us to understand where the long rounds stem from. Your help with this will be greatly appreciated.

(And, of course, if any of you really do prefer to play slowly, please feel free to book one of the last two games.)

#### **Sunday Starters**

For some weeks the starting process has been pretty ad hoc. Helpful club members who always turn up early have written the latest list of names on the board and made changes where needed due to late arrivals etc. Whilst not being the ideal method, it seems to work and if it is not broke, don't fix it! Thanks to all those early birds who are proving so invaluable!!

However, at his time of year starting times are at a premium and we must make sure we do not have games going out late.

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## FAST PLAY - SPEED IS OF THE ESSENCE

With the shortened daylight hours in winter it is important that we all take on board the need to complete our rounds of golf as quickly as possible in order that the later games can be completed before the courses are closed.

Here are some memory joggers to help us proceed quickly and efficiently:-

- Walk don't stroll
- Be prepared to tee off with a club, ball and tee at the ready don't dither
- Have a provisional ball close at hand
- Play a provisional ball if there is <u>any doubt</u> that the original may not be found or it may be out of bounds
- Tee off out of turn if this saves time
- Tee off before marking score cards if this saves time
- Play out of turn if this saves time
- Clear the green as quickly as possible to allow approaching players to proceed – and do not stand on the green casually marking score cards
- Around the greens, leave bags and trolleys in a handy place to pick up for the next tee
- Wherever possible putt out on the greens rather than mark and pick up
- In Stableford or Bogey events, pick up when out of points or the hole is lost
- Make a conscious effort to speed up if a gap appears between your game and the one in front – and remind your fellow players of the need for 'fast play'
- Don't daydream watch your fellow players to see where their shots have landed and assist in searches as necessary
- Call the following game 'up' if a search is in progress and let the game 'through' if it is ready to proceed before your game
- Keep an eye on the following game and assist with ball watching to prevent unnecessary searches (e.g. 3<sup>rd</sup> hole on the Princes).
- Don't linger at the tea hut
- Don't stand on the 18<sup>th</sup> having hugs and kisses!
