NEWS: PROPOSED COURSE CHANGES & NEW CLUB HOUSE

1. THE PROPOSALS

At the beginning of November, the Royal Parks Association (RPA) and Glendale Golf finally submitted their planning application to the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames for re-development of Richmond Park Golf Course. The proposals include construction of a new clubhouse in the south–east corner of the course (Princes 7th and 9th green area) with access through Clohole gate, a 20 bay driving range (on the adjacent former nursery land), a 5-hole academy course, changes to 11 of the 18 holes on the current Princes Course, and re-ordering of the holes on both courses, including assigning 4 of the Dukes' holes to the Princes Course and 4 of the Princes' holes to the Dukes Course. This planning application follows on from the consultation exercise they held a few months ago. The proposals are little changed from those that are displayed in the Glendale Café. The Council has 16 weeks to consider the application and make a decision, which means we can expect their decision by the end of February 2008. Full details of the application are on Richmond Council's website and Peter Harrington has printed a copy of all the submission documents, which will be available to view in the cabin.

Attached to this newsletter are the 'cards' for the revised courses, indicating the changes that are proposed by Glendale.

2. OUR RESPONSE TO THE PROPOSALS

We are aware from views expressed at the time of Glendale's consultation that a significant number of our members are dismayed at the extent of the changes Glendale are proposing for the course, and the Princes Course in particular. Several members wrote in with their comments and, on behalf of the club, Peter Harrington submitted detailed concerns about the clubhouse and changes/shortening of the Princes Course. Notwithstanding the comments that have already been made, we now have our final opportunity (collectively and individually) to try and influence what developments actually take place at the park. This is by making representations to the Council, as well as collectively to the RPA/Glendale. Please take time to look at the proposals and then let a committee member know your thoughts.

3. MEETING WITH THE RPA & GLENDALE

Peter Harrington and I attended a meeting with the Royal Parks and Glendale last Thursday (Nov 22nd) to discuss the comments and concerns that our club submitted about the clubhouse and course change proposals during the consultation period. At the meeting, the RPA and Glendale explained the rationale behind their proposals and we went through our specific comments on their proposed changes to the courses. There have been a few revisions to the original Glendale proposal arising out of Peter's submitted comments and we are hopeful that the discussions at our meeting may lead to other amendments, but we are not holding our breath.

Glendale's position on several points about the future operation of the course and clubhouse were made clear at the meeting. These included that:-

(i) Glendale will not require the present individual clubs to amalgamate into a single club, and we will be able operate to much have we have done in the past, however we will need to co-operate with the other clubs in arranging a single point of contact with Glendale; and

(ii) Glendale plan to keep the new clubhouse and its catering facilities open for as long as possible, and well after the dusk closing of Richmond Park.

4. THE OTHER ASSOCIATION CLUBS

There have not been any meetings with the other Association of Richmond Park Golf Clubs during the past year, but we have been invited to attend one before Xmas – no doubt to discuss the future!
