

Keys Challenge Trophy

Runners Up : Centurions Golf Club

The Keys Challenge Trophy is open to the member clubs of the Richmond Park Association Golf Club (RPAGC) and the winning club and the runners-up are the RPAGC's two automatic entries for the SCGU Surrey Fives event for the succeeding year. The Keys Trophy is a large shield which has been played for annually since 1964 and is engraved with the winning team's name. The trophy is presented to the winning team on the day of the event.

Each of the participating clubs enters four men players. The format is stroke play with a full handicap allowance. The lowest aggregate of the combined four scores is the winning team.

There were entries for this year's Keys Trophy by Richmond Park, Putney Park, Centurions, and the Alton Golf Society. Richmond Park was represented by Richard Owen, Graeme Syme, Paul Doran and John Morris. The competition was played in glorious sunshine on the same day as all the member RPAGC clubs were playing the Trevor Allen Open.

Richmond Park won the day with a cumulative net score of 279; Centurions scored 284; and Putney Park and the Altons both came in with 294 (almost 4 shots/player behind the Richmond park team). Lowest scores were John Toygar (Centurions) with a 64 and John Morris (Richmond Park) with a 65. These players also came 1st and 3rd in the Trevor allen Open.
