The National Association of Public Golf Courses is the Body who organise most of our External Competitions. The Main Team Events are:-

#### The Hawtree Trophy

Mixed Foursomes Matchplay. Traditionally the Men's and Ladies' Captains jointly choose the teams of 5 men and 5 ladies.

### **Clapham Common Shield**

This main NAPGC event is played in Greensomes stableford format. 3 pairs of men play at the Home Course whilst 3 pairs of men play at the Away club. The Team with the highest aggregate points goes through to the next round. Teams are chosen by the Captain- watch the notice board to see if you are picked.

#### White Webbs Trophy

This is the ladies Main event and is played in teams of 5. The format is singles Matchplay at either the Home or the Away Course.

The NAPGC also arrange the Men's and Ladies' Championships of England. Keep an eye out for the Qualifying Rounds of these prestigious competitions.

In addition there are Open Days run by the NAPGC for mixed and singles events. See the Secretary for details.
