# PAUL APPLETON - NEW CLUB CHAMPION

# Junior title goes to *Phil Flanagan*

Congratulations to *Paul Appleton* who is our Club Champion for 2002. Paul had two rounds of 77 for a 154 total to win the senior division (H/Caps 0-16) by five shots from *Robert Urquhart* who had rounds of 81 and 78 for 159. *John Collender* came third with 83 and 78 for a total of 161.

**Phil Flanagan** won the Junior title with rounds of 88 and 89 for a total of 177 and won by four shots from **Bob Lovejoy** (90 and 91) and **Richard Owen** (89 and 92) who shared second place on 181.

The Handicap prize, for the best net score over the two rounds of the Club Championship, went to *Paul Appleton* with two rounds of 65 (130) who won by five shots from *Robert Urquhart* who had rounds of 69 and 66 for 135. (Full competition results follow on the next page.)

# **COMPETITION ENTRY**

There has been some confusion recently concerning the Club rule for competition entries on a Sunday and this notice was issued by *Peter Harrington* our **Club Secretary** to clarify the arrangements.

Except for those rare days, when normal play is not possible, the Club arranges one or more events every Sunday for all members.

It is a rule of the Club, that all members who play on a Sunday within the Club's booking allocation, are automatically entered for the event of the day unless (a) a member is playing in a Club match or NAPGC competition or similar event, or (b) a member is playing in a Club knockout event, or (c) a member has a dispensation from an Officer from the Committee.

Every Member who plays in the event of the day is obliged to pay the relevant competition entry fee, which is typically £1. Members who forget to pay the competition entry fee or those who arrive late and cannot pay in the normal manner, are still automatically entered for the day's event and are obliged to pay the entry fee at a later date if necessary.

There is no obligation to enter the sweep for the day. A member who forgets to enter a sweep, will not be included retroactively.

So now you know the rule, don't forget to put your entry and sweep money in the envelope provided when you book in on a Sunday. Many members this year and in previous years have lost out on sweep money simply by not doing this.
