### **Annual Subscriptions and the New Handicapping System**

Under the new Unified Handicapping System, that now applies to both men and ladies, there is a rule that members rejoining more than six months after the renewal date are required to complete the handicap qualification process before a handicap can be awarded.

This means that any member rejoining after 1<sup>st</sup> August 2004 will be deemed to have a Lapsed Handicap and will not being able to play in Club competitions. They will also be obliged to complete three cards for assessment before receiving an official Club handicap.
